Storm Preparedness STAY INFORMED

Keep ahead of storms by listening to NOAA Weather Radio, commercial radio and television. The National Weather Service continuously broadcasts warnings and forecasts that can be received by NOAA Weather Radios, which are sold in many stores. Make sure your radio has a battery back-up and a Specific Area Message Encoder feature, which automatically alerts you when a watch or warning is issued for your county or area.

OUTLOOK - Storm conditions are possible in the next 2-5 days.

WHAT TO LISTEN FOR:

- WATCH Storm conditions are possible within the next 36-48 hours, prepare now.
- WARNING Life threatening severe weather conditions have begun or will begin within 24 hours, act now.
- **ADVISORY Weather conditions are** expected to cause significant inconveniences and my be hazardous. If you are cautious, these situations should not be life threatening.

Roscommon County Sheriff Randy Stevenson traveled to Roscommon County Ireland to represent Roscommon, MI at the Gathering Celebrations of Roscommon. During this sister-city celebration Sheriff Stevenson presented the County of Roscommon (Ireland) officials with our own Roscommon County flag (shown below) and was able to see the County of Roscommon's (Ireland) government in action as they sat in on a meeting similar to that of one of our own County Commissioner Board Meetings. Law enforcement is totally different as the police force in Ireland is on a national level and is called a "consent police force." There are no township police or county sheriff offices. Ireland is made up of 32 counties and County Roscommon has a population of 64,065* (over double ours) with 984 square miles (over 400 more than ours) of lakes, rivers and wooded country side. Roscommon is the capital of County Roscommon, Ireland and it is home of the only Lamb Festival in Ireland. It is also a great fishing and outdoor recreational area and its modern boundaries were established in 1585, however its origins date back to the

medieval period with its name being derived from Ros (wooded, gentle height) and Coman (first abbot and founder's name). *2011 Census
