
ACT-NOW GAP REPORT

GAP #1

INVESTIGATING OFFICERS

Officer LaBonte and Officer Muszynski

TYPE OF COMPLAINT

Hit and Run/O.W.I. (Operating While Intoxicated)

09/20/2014 - Hit and Run

09/21/2014 - O.W.I.

LOCATION

W. Federal Highway

The owner of a residence on W. Federal Highway called and reported that sometime between 1400 hrs and 2145 hrs on 09/20/2014, someone hit his wood mailbox protector and did not stop to report the accident. The owner advised Officers the property cost was approximately \$55. Officers located a passenger side mirror and a fender flare that appeared to have come off a blue Chevrolet pickup.

Officers were unable to locate the suspect vehicle that night. On 09/21/2014 Officers stopped a vehicle matching the description of the suspect vehicle which was missing the passenger side mirror and fender flare, and also had fresh damage on the passenger side. The vehicle was stopped for suspected drunk driving. When Officers asked the driver what happened he admitted to the accident and stated he was not sure what he hit or where it was at. Officers asked the driver why he did not stop and report the accident and he stated he was too intoxicated. The driver advised Officers the accident occurred around 2130 hrs. The driver was not injured. Officers issued the driver a citation for Accident, Failed to stop and identify and arrested him for O.W.I.

Larceny from a building



Vehicle #1 was S/B on I-75 at 55 MPH, per the driver. She lost control on what was found to be black ice, ran off the roadway right and eventually rolled the vehicle up onto its side. The driver reported she was not injured, but was originally trapped in the vehicle and was pulled from the vehicle after the vehicle was stabilized. Gerrish Township Fire/EMS evaluated the driver and she refused transport to the hospital. Witnesses indicate that the vehicle was traveling straight, suddenly lost control and veered off the roadway right where it rolled onto its side. They attempted to get the lone driver out but were unable to do so by the time the Fire Department arrived.

Burning Ordinance Violation



Officer Martin was dispatched to a residence on Pontchartrain Lane. Officer Martin arrived on scene and made contact with two male subjects at the residence. Officer Martin advised both male subjects of the burning complaint. Officer Martin noted that while speaking with the subjects, he could smell a strong odor of burning plastic. The subjects stated that they are cleaning up the house because their grandmother just passed away. One of the subjects stated that they are burning boxes and other household items in the fire. Officer Martin advised the subjects that Gerrish Township has a Trash and Leaf Burning Ordinance that states you are not allowed to burn cardboard or other household items and provided them with a copy of the ordinance. Officer Martin advised them that the fire must be put out. The subjects stated they understood and put the fire out by dumping water on it with large bowls of water. No citation was given.
