SHOP WITH A COP

How it works...before Christmas the selected families provide a list of needs and complete an application. Once the families are selected, one child from each family goes with Officers and shops for gifts and are treated to dinner at the restaurant of their choice. Volunteers from ACT NOW and the Gerrish Twp. Police Dept. wrap and tag all of the gifts and deliver them to the families a few days before Christmas. We sponsor 7 families each year. This is a different program than others you may hear about locally such as "Shop with a Hero."

Since 2002, the Gerrish Township Police Dept. and ACT NOW have sponsored our Shop-With-A-Cop community program and have brightened the holidays for 168 families including 583 children and 279 adults!

Applications come to us through the assistance of the staff at our local schools and we sponsor new families each year. Applications are also available at the Gerrish Township Police Department and all applications must be submitted by November 25, 2024.

❖ The first Thanksgiving was celebrated in 1621 and lasted three days. It included 50 Pilgrims, 90 Wampanoag Indians, and it is believed that only five women were present. ❖ Abraham Lincoln proclaimed Thanksgiving a National Holiday on October 3, 1863. ❖ There are four towns in the United Stated named "Turkey" and they can be found in Arizona, Texas, Louisiana and North Carolina. ❖ The average number of calories consumed on Thanksgiving is 4,500. ❖ Butterball answers more than 100,000 turkey-cooking questions via their hotline each November and December. ❖ The tradition of football on Thanksgiving began in 1876 with a game between Yale and Princeton. The first NFL games were played on Thanksgiving in 1920. ❖ 293.3 million people will eat Turkey this Thanksgiving. ❖ Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade began in 1924 and featured live animals borrowed from the Central Park Zoo. Animals were replaced in 1927 by large character balloons, Felix the Cat was the first balloon. ❖ More than 54 million Americans are expected to travel during the Thanksgiving holiday this year.
