SHOP WITH A COP

Our 2024 Shop-With-A-Cop Program was a huge success! We had 22 individual and business donors that contributed over \$3,500.00 to this years program. We were able to sponsor 10 families which included 18 children and 11 adults.

Applications for the program were obtained with the assistance of the Roscommon Area Public Schools and the families were selected based on criteria including need (household income), family size, monthly expenses and employment status. We do not repeat families from year to year so if an applicant has already been a program recipient in the past they would not qualify for the current year. Officers from the Gerrish Twp. Police Department shop with one child per family and then treat them to dinner or lunch afterwards. It is usually the oldest child from each family or a child that needs some one-on-one positive contact with an officer.

All of the gifts were wrapped by members of the community, ACT NOW, CERT and GTPD on December 16th and all the gifts were delivered to the individual families by GTPD officers on December 19th.

The Gerrish Township Police Department began their Shop-With-A-Cop program in 2002 and since then have given back over \$90,800.00 to the community assisting families in need at Christmas. To date, the program has helped out 178 families, 601 children and 290 adults with gifts and special needs for the holiday season.

We would like to THANK all of our program donors who continue to sponsor this great event year after

Kids Helping Kids

December of 2024 marked our "16th Annual" Kids Helping Kids Program. This program is different from our Shop-With-A-Cop Program as it is directed toward Roscommon County Foster Children and Foster Families.

Every year we partner with local agencies and groups to provide Christmas gifts and gift cards for food for foster children and their families. The children names and gift suggestions are provided by the Department of Health and Human Services and confidentiality is a requirement. Youth groups in our community shop for the gifts and wrap them with the assistance of committee volunteers and youth group leaders. DHHS staff deliver the gifts to the children and their families during the first part of December.

This year we provided gifts for 52 children placed in 21 families. Funding for this year's program came from:

We are still anticipating a donation from the Roscommon County Sheriff's Office "No Shave" 2024 Fundraiser. Over \$8,100.00 was spent on food gift cards for the families and presents for the children this year. As a note, each foster child only receives a \$25 gift card at Christmas from the State of Michigan which is why we started this program many years ago.

Roscommon Food Distribution Partnership

Each month the Gerrish Twp. Police
Department and volunteers from the Gerrish
CERT team assist with the MDHHS drivethru Food Distributions that are held at the
Roscommon Area Public Schools campus.
We have been assisting with these monthly
events since 2020 to help provide a
seamless flow with traffic as many people
line up early and vehicles have to wrap
around the Roscommon Middle School
parking levels and make their way down to
the Bus Garage area where the food is
distributed from.

In 2024, 2,908 families were served and 6,334 individuals were served. 242 first-time families and 528 first-time individuals were served in 2024. 283 pallets of food were distributed totaling 211,137 pounds. 799 volunteers assisted throughout the year, this includes students and adults.

We would like to THANK CERT Coordinator Bob Barber and the CERT volunteers that help out with this event each and every month. It takes a lot of planning and work to coordinate this community service and we appreciate the effort!
